Following his wife's witst and explanation of her formeely fruitless search for the right place to get her car repaired, John went back to his cell and in his words, 'fell on my knees and committed my life to the Lord.' Finally discovering who

Finally discovering who could repair his broken life, John began steering a new course for the future. He had known very little about the libble, but now started reading it daily to learn more about his newfound faith.

Finding others in the prison who had made the same life-changing discovery and joining them for chapel services enriched John's life, bringing spiritual growth that was evident to his wife, his family and those incarcerated with him. When he was released from prison, John was a different man, giving much of his time to helping others find the answers he had sought 50 long.


