DAVOS, Switzerland (AF) – Microsoft founder Bill Gates has announced a \$200 million grant to help identify and solve the 'grand challenges in global health' that the private sector has little financial incentive to tackle. Under the program announced at the annual World Economic Forum Sunday, a

announced at the annual World Economic Forum Sunday, a panel of top scientists will draft a list of critical problems whose solution could lead to important advances for the developing world, such as nevel ways to combat the AIDS virus or to prevent mosquitoes from transmitting malaria.

The Foundation for the National Institutes of Health in Washington then will navard grants of up to \$20 million to linvestigate them.

This to me is an opportunity for us to come together as a

for us to come together as a world community to find world solutions to health problems affecting all of us, said U.S. Health and Human Services Secretary Tommy Thompson,

whose department includes the National Institutes of Health. At a news conference with Gates, Thompson noted Secretary of State Colin Powell's recent remarks that the fight appinst HIV infection and AIDS is 'Digger than the war on terror."

wat on terror."
"People really don't understand that, but it truly is,"
Thompson said.

The money comes from the Bill and Melinda Gates Illi and Melindu Gates
Foundation, which has focused
on promoting health care in
poor countries. He said he was
super-sexited by the team
working on the initiative, which
said he was under monitor with
great interest\* but not personally participate in.
Chairing the board will be
Dr. Harold Varmus, a Nobel
laureate and president of the
Memorial Sloan-Kettering
Cancer Center in New York.
NIH director Ellan Zerbunni.

NIH director Ellas Zerhouni, who will also serve on the board, noted that his agency -one of the world's leading centers on biomedical research – spends \$2.6 billion annually on

AIDS - "which affects obviously the United States" – and only about \$300 million on other global health issues.
"So about 10, II perent of our budget relates to potentially 90 percent of the urgent disease in the world," he said, If easil he hoped the new "public-private" model would help fill the gap in research capacity.

Progress will not be made Progress will not be made unless we are able to interest the ... topflight acientizis today to get involved in adapting all the progress we have made to date ... to the diseases that affect the developing world, he said.

Said Serageldin, a former World Bank adviser, said governments and philanthropies had to do more for diseases prevalent in the developing world because there are no big potential profits that would interest drug companies.
