Dude ranch doubles as year-round camp

Make no mistake about it, the Double JJ ranch north of Muskegon is all resort - from tis copy cabins and upscale condominums to its rubing hills, horseback riding trails and snowmobile course. But to owner Robert Lipsitz of Bloomfield Hills, the sprawling family playground - a 65-year-old former summer-only duderanch - reminds him of camp.

LONG HISTORY

The couple bought the property in 1988 after Lipsitz left his directorship at Camp Tennarack. He planned to turn the dude ranch, which opened in 1937, into a boot camp for troubled boys. He contracted with the state to open a facility, but when it restricted funding, continued to operate as a recreational facility.

We're the fourth family to own it is seven years. If was an operating dude much—and had been since the 70x—for adults. From troubled youth to troubled adults - there really was no difference. The only difference was when you wanted to send them home, you didn't have to call their parents, he said, laughing.

"In the 1930s, it was called the Jack and Jill Ranch and

Contest opens doors for minority musicians

Aaron Dworkin is working toward a goal. He's hoping to attract people of all colors to the classical music stage and audience. It seems we share a dream.

Although diversity in the classical music world has come a long way in the 12 1/2 years that I've been covering arts for the Observer & Eccentric, it's rare for me to write about an event with an African-American or minority theme outside of February. Don't get me wrong. I think it's great that more and more concerts are being scheduled during Black. History Month. I'd just like to see them occur regularly throughout the year.

That's wily Dworkin's Sphins competition for young black and Latino string musicians is so important. In the six years since Dworkin founded Sphinx, he's seen a 25 percent increase in applicants, several of whom have gone on to top music schools including Juilliard in Manhattan. More qualified minority students means more qualified minority musicians performing with major orchestras.

Dworkin grew up learning to play violin in Manhattan. He eventually moved to Hershey, Pa., and later to northern Michigan to attend Interlochen Arts Academy for
