In its 23rd year, the exposition offers hundreds of antiques, among them a selection of American, European, Oriental and African pieces, for purchase. The broad range of merchandise is what people like

While the exposition's pop-ularity is partly due to timing - it's one of the first major local antiques shows of the year - merchandise prices have broad appeal, Butler asid.
