## Union pickets outside church construction site

Union Plumbers Local 98 picketed peacefully outside a construction entrance of a new church being built off Eight Mile near Halsted in Farmington Hills this week.

Employees of Blue Dot working at the site agreed to union representation, and the company was ordered to comply in January 2002, said Mike McIlroy, vice president representing Local 98.

So far, Blue Dot, which has bought up smaller construction firms in the area such as Bergstrom, Wiegler, Cast and Cherry, has not granted the contract request, said McIlroy.

"They continue to sit at the table," he said. "They're still picking up (construction) jobs while negotiating with us."

A Blue Dot representative did not return phone calls.

Carlos Castiglione, business representative for Plumbers Local 98, said about 66 employees are represented in the union and Pipefitters Local 636, who were picketing this week.

He said it is important to keep tradespeople in training with the apprenticeship program the union provides and make sure employees are getting fair pay and benefits.

"But they can't until they sign a contract

with us," Castiglione said. He said the more than a dozen protesters were bringing about awareness to Blue Dot's actions to the public to encourage them to move forward with settling a contract.
