Bowling alliance strikes out, but could be revived in future

One of the most prolific of all American Bowling Congress conventions has just taken place March 12-14 in Knowille, Tenn.
This was the 108th ABC convention, running hand-in-hand with the 100th ABC Championship Tournament. The very future of bowling was in the hands and ballots of the 1,259 delegates who were there to make the final decision on a Single Membership Organization (SMO) proposal which started up two years ago.
