Embezzlement case heads to Circuit Court

An embezzlement case involving a former youth footiful and cheerleading organization president continues next tooth in Oakland County Circuit Contr.
Ralph Kevin Maly, 47, of Farmington, redged as president of the Farmington as president of the Farmington Football mice board. Police allege he took nearly \$10,000 from the organization. He waived his preliminary exam in 47th District Court last week and faces an arraignment before Circuit Judge Richard Kuhn at 8:30 n.m. Wednesday, April 8. Sparking the investigation was a complaint filed with Farmington's Department of Public Safety by someone involved in the sports organization. There were apparently several irregularities with the equipment ordering process, including typographical and mathematical errors on involved. Police said the board became suspicious when they notice players were still using old equipment after Maly told them new equipment had been ordered. A Farmington Public Safety Department to westigation revealed Maly claimed to have

purchased football equipment with his credit card, then approached the organization for repayment. Police contacted the companies where Maly said the ordered equipment, but found no record of the orders. Further, Invoices Maly supplied to the board did not resemble real invoices, police said.

If convicted, Maly faces a maximum sentence of five years in prison and/or a 56,000 fine. He was arraigned March I in 47th District court on a felony charge of embezzlement. He continues to be free on bond. Maly has declined to comment on the case.
