"It's a lot of responsibility for someone under 30," said Brian.

Television is on 24 hours in the Brewer home to keep tabs of the latest developments in the war.

The pastor said despite personal opinions about the war, the church and his family have to show support for the men and women putting their lives on the line.

"This is really about support for our troops," he said. "That's why we are there, so the people here can still have the right to protest."

Brian said his son told him he is there for the long-term goal of giving the Iraqi people the same privileges Americans enjoy. The two haven't spoken on the phone

since Chad was shipped to the Middle East March 5.

Chad's wife Sarah is a police dispatcher in Ann Arbor.

"She misses him, but she knows what he is doing is important," Brian said.

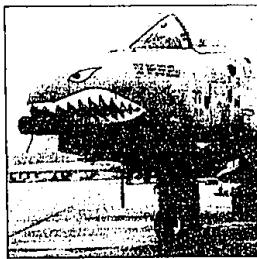
The pastor noted church members put up ribbons and a sign that states support for the nation, the president and the troops.

"I think it's necessary from time to time to help people help themselves," he said of America's involvement in Iraq.
