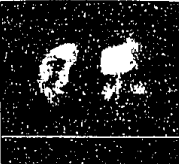

The exhibit dispels certain myths about the Serols, but even the most learned scholars won't be able to find all the answers. Still, they are the earliest manuscripts known to Christians as the Old Testament and relate stories that provide the bedrock for three major world religions.
So important to Jews, Christians and Muslims alike, this reminder of our common roots has never been more important or relevant.
Imagine yourself in the caves of the Dead Sea Scrolls, and you'll see a human heritage far more important

than the religious, cultural and traditional differences that so easily tear us apart.

Hours for the exhibition are 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Sunday-Tuesday and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Wednesday-Saturday. Tickets are \$14 for adults, \$10.50 for ages 17 and under; organized adult groups of 20 or more are \$13 per person.
