## Report details what's new at SWOCC

New,was the word for 2002 at Southwestern Oakland Cable Commission. SWOCC moved into its newly



SWOCC moved into its newly renovated 10,000 square foot facility. This meant new state-of-the-art digit-quipment, which enabled us to do some new production (like live, simulcast and call-in shows). We also incorporated some new things with previous equipment purchases, like adding channels 8 and 13 to playback on the Vela file server.

But the best news comes in production numbers. Despite the "down-time" to allow for installation, set-up and training in the new facility, production numbers actually interessed over the previous year.

Sometimes, it's like comparing apples and oranges. An hour-long studio shoot may take two hours to produce from start to finish, whereas a two-minute remote piece could take weeks to put together. SWOCC Studios employs a variety of production techniques including digital graphies and nonlinear editing which adds to the overall creative appeal of a production. At other times, we may tape a councileperson in the new studio and have the piece on the channel within minutes.

Farmington Hills Video
Division Channel 8 moved into
the new SWOCC facility, sharing space, resources technical

SWOCC facilitated Farmington 18 programming on the Vela file server resulting in increased pleyback schedules to truz 44 hours a day, 7 days a week. SWOCC built on the citys annual live Santa Call-in program by enblecasting live out of both studies (Santa in one, musical acts in the other) while integrating new production values, the new Tryptione system, live CG and new 1FB communication.

SWOCC executed new programs including weekly

Updates, Downtown Bit, Islam:

program and charitable event
promo, and the Grand River

SWOCC took over playback of Novi Channel 13 (From Novi City Hall to SWOCC Studios) resulting in better quality playback, a quicker turn-around in new programming and longer playback blocks. SWOCC established new programming with Novi's new Community Relations Director including Shery In The City, High School Hockey tournaments, regular Novi Road Construction Updates, and Novi Police: AED. SWOCC also helped the city continuely with old favorites including: Happy Reading, Ask The Answer Man. Theatre Performances, The Reading, Ask The Answer Man, Theatre Performances, The Memorial Day Parade, Annual River Day, Pherst Farm Events, and Novi Police Streetbeat. A majority of former public access users returned to the new SWOCC Studios to begin volunteering on Public Access shoots. SWOCC restructured workshops to make them more user-friendly and facilitate the greatest mount of wars.

were unable to produce in the
studio for four months during
the transition to the new building, there were almost 75 percent more productions in 2002

shoots and 60 remote shoots
totaled 167 new programs compared with 99 for 2001. On top
of that, 85 different "outside"
projects (those not produced at
SWOCC or with SWOCC
equipment) were submitted for
total of 561 shows for playback on INFO TV-12.

SWOCCs coverage of the

least four new volunteers for
their organization.
The move from 5,000 to
