Hospital unit cares for <text><text><text><text> senior mental health needs

Demonstrating a commit-ment to offering older adult services, Botiford General Hospital has maintained a ded-icated unit for geropsychiatric

icated unit for geropsychiatric patients. Receiving referrals of other hospitals' difficult cases since 1987, Botsford's 22-bed geropsychiatry unit is known in the health care community as being able to successfully treat patients 55 years or older who present with a complicated interplay of physical and psy-chological problems related to aging.

aging. Sandra Plumer, the unit's director since the program director since the program began 15 years ago, comments, "It is casier to treat frail elderly people, who are suffering from combinations of emotional and physical illnesses, in an envi-ronment designed to meet their needs. Older adults have spe-cials needs.

ronment designed to meet their rends. Older adulus have spe-cials needs." She added, "Their caregivers should be very knowledgeable about medication interactions and the physical ailments of the elderly. Our physicans are baard-certified in geristric psy-chiatry and consult as a team with other medical specialists on Botsforik's staff to stabilize the patient's condition." Most patients are unable to recognize they need mental health treatment; two-blirds are admitted on an involuntary basis. Plumer stresses mental illness is not a normal part of signs. She cautions primary care physicians and family members to be watchful for signs of persistent personality changes or unusual behavior exhibited by their elderly patients or loved ones. Depression and anxiety, which are commonity diagnosed admitted to the unit 24 hours day. Referrals come from plysi-clans, psychologists, social workers, other mental health professionals, social service agencies, clenzy, family mem-bers or friends, however, the unit's psychiatrists make admission decisions.
