"It was an important goal, because we had so many opportunities to finish," Russell said. "We had them back on their heels. The girls went right after them."
North outplayed Mott in the first half but faced a one-goal deficit after one of the Corsairs found the range from 45 yards on what Russell called a bloop shot.
The score stayed 1-0 for much of the second half until Chris Gabriel tied it on a pass from Boothroyd with 22 minutes remaining.
"Chris Gabriel made a terrific run to the far post," Russell said. "Michelle Boothroyd sent a low, hard cross through the box and Chris finished it. It was a very disciplined set up."
Mott went ahead again at 10:18 after converting a penalty kick.
"It's kinda unfortunate we had to work so hard to win it," Russell said, adding the Corsairs had only seven shots and no other good ones besides the one they scored on.
North's young defense, led by its only upper classman, Brie Loveland, played its best game, according to Russell.
"Avis Kaplan filled in at stopper because of an injury," he said. "She played well beyond her years, stopping the ball and making terrific passes to her teammates."
Sweeper Christina Navas and wing defender Adrienne Sundquist had their best games, he added.
"Sundquist's touches today were just about perfect," Russell said. "Mott was sending the ball deep, and she kept stepping into the passing lanes and intercepting them."
Boothroyd and Ashley Lynch were outstand-

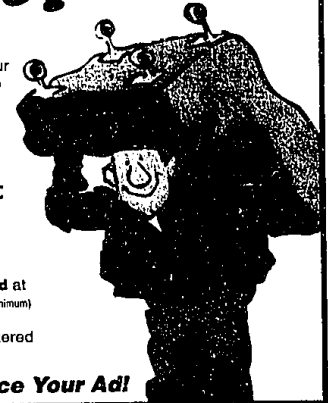
