Farmer Jack at 8 Mile/Grand River to close

A Livonia Farmer Jack store on Fight Mile at Grand River will close at the end of April, one of four Detroit area stores set to be closed by the supermarket

chain.

All employees of the store will be offered jobs at autrounding Farmer Jack stores, according to Mike Carter, Farmer Jack president.

Bach store set to close is losing money, has a small sales volume and a relatively small staff, Carter said.

Farmer Jack has operated the 54,000-square-foot store on Eight Mile since 1975.

"It's kind of an odd shape," he said. He noted that the company's 100 stores in the area are always under reconsideration, based on shifting demands, competition and aging facili-ties.

will be renovated.

"We know when we open a store that we take customers away. We cannibalized some of our other stores," Carter

The other stores being closed besides the Livonia site will be in Warren, Detroit and Eastpointe. At the same time, Farmer Jack announced it will be opening three new stores - Detroit, Milford and Dearborn Gradets.

said.


Based on the new stores and replacement workers, Carter said, "We predict the impact of 500 additional employees."
