Vora Severovas, senior, Groves: The 6-foot-6 post player was one of the top big men in the metro area, leading the Falcons to a 20-4 record and a runner-up finish in a Class A regional. Severovas was Groves' leading rebounder for three years, dur-

three years, dur-ing which time

the Falcons won 50 of 59 games, and its leading scorer two years. He had his most productive season this year, averaging 24 points and 14 rebounds. Throughout his three years on the varsity, he averaged 19 points, 12 rebounds and three blocks per

game.
"Vova had a tremendous high school career, and he will continue to progress as a college player," coach Bill Norton said. "He was a legitimate candidate for Mr. Basketball."

Glordan Watson, senior, Groves: Watson was the perfect backcourt complement to Severovas play near the basket.

The 5-foot-10 guard not only directed the offense, averaging six assists per game, but contributed a great deal to it. He was the Falcons second-leading scorer with an average of 21 points.

Watson finished his prep career in fitting fashlon. In four tournament games, he scored 26 points against Oak Park, 24 against Sacholm, 32 against defending state champion Pontiac Northern and 21 against West Bloomfield.

Schaffer, who received a Division I
scholarship to the University of
Wisconsin-Green Bay, is the leading

points this year, as well as 12.5
rebounds and 4-6 assists. Schaffer finished his career with 1,188 points. He
also holds the Adams record for most
points in a single game (41).

ije Iwankwo, senior, Country Day: Nwankwo was a major reason the Yellows Jackets were 21-3 and regional finalist in the Class B tournament.
