Former resident creates art for White House

Ginna Parsons-Lagergren, daughter of Bill and Sally Parsons, has created a piece of art for the White House and the G.W. Bush Presidential Library.
Parsons-Lagergren grew up with her family in Farmington but since 1971 she has lived near Sun Valley, Idaha, while Ilill and Sally Parsons are residents of Lukeway, Teves.
Parsons-Lagergren has been a professional artist for almost 40 years and has been represented in galleries throughout the west since 1986. She received the White House commission from the American Egg Board, who has created a display of decorated eggs for the last 12 years, representing each State, installing them in the White House for four weeks at Easter time and then into the Presidential Library. A gallery in the Sun Valley area was contacted by the American Egg who recommended Ginna to represent Idaha for this year's egg art Ilaha for this year's egg art and Novi."
