place, a credo we should all remember.

Schmid describes hundreds of shade-loving plants in (as he says) plain English, listing height, flower, fruit, family and more. Take time to savor this down-to-earth advice; you may be encouraged to find a shady nook in your own back yard. The Encyclopedia of Planting in Combination, by Tony, Lord, plotos by Andrew Lawson (Firelly, \$59,95), contains 4,000 color and planting schemes and 1,000 plant descriptions with full-color photos.

Lord advises readers to establish the overall effect desired; trees, major shrubs and hedges should be decided on first. You should include evergreens. Be aware of form and texture; harmonious colors are lasting; and for borders, carefully make a planting plan. Each entry includes height and spread, typical flowering eason, a color barshowing full range of light levels, a raindrop symbol to show a plant's preferred soil water content, colored symbols to show preferred soil conditions, and zone and pH ranges.

Plan ahead and grow things that can be dried for indoor beauty when summer is just a memory. Natural Decor: The Arranger's Garden and Project Book from Seed to Centerpiece. Sooma Concy (The Lyons Press, \$19.95), will set you on the right track.

Concy shares information about gathering in the wild, plant identification, proper tools and other tricks of the trade. Each project contains a "list of ingredients."

Grow Wild! Low-Maintenance, Sure-Success, Distinctive Gardening with Native Plants, by Lorraine Johnson (Fulerum \$22.95), is organized by regions (we are in the Northeast Region).

"There are many different approaches to the use of native plants and no one right way," the author says. "Just a single wild bergamot plant, tentaively purchased by a curious soul and added to a bed of exotics, will offer nectar to butterflies, bees and humminghirds and seeds to birds and will perhaps inspire that curious soul to try other natives."

Johnson describes appropriate plants for the regions and takes us through some successful gardens. She shares the low-down on how to correctly create natural gardens, and suggests looking at local native plant communities in the wild. Excellent addice.

The Perfect Michigan Lawn: Attaining and Maintaining the Lawn Four Want, by Melinda Myers (Cod Springs Press, \$12,99), is now available, just in time for our growing senson. Myers is an award-winning horticulturist and gives good advice. She discusses the best grass varieties and suggests a maintenance schedule, and explains various methods of planting a new lawn or renovating an existing one.

In addition, she provides recommendations on how to address those inevitable lawn problems, such as weeds, discussed and increases and insect pests, while still being kind to Mother Nature.

Myers rounds out the book with information about how to fertilize, water and mow to protote a healthy lawn, and be a




