What can I get you? Laura asks, as two customers approach the sliding front service window. Longtime customers Paul and Cheryl Parcha order ice cream in small clear plastic cups - vanilla for Cheryl and a mix of chocolate

and vanilla for Paul.

They used to have a bigger cow, Faul said, recalling the vandalism done in recent years to the replica bovine that helps make the Silver Dairy a landmark. We have two kids: we usually ride our bikes here—that way you burn it off before you get home.

Tending to another customer, Lurar Harris passes by bunches of yellow-green bananas in plastic bags, and trays of Spanish peanuts, chopped pecans and walnuts. In another plastic tray are multicolored blue, green, red and yellow sprinkles. Spatulas and large metal spoons rest on end in an oversized clear plastic measuring cup, with red markings.


