## Asia is exotic feast for the camera

ooking for an unusual, exotic place to go...full of exphotographic opportunities and relatively inexpensive to travel through? Well, I recently visited Thuiland and it has my strongest endorse-

Asia has always fascinated me and having enjoyed pho-tographic trips to China and Korea, Thailand was a natural

Korea, Thailand was a natural choice.

We started in the North at Chiang Ral, near the "Golden Thiangle" where Burma, Loos and Thailand touch at a common point. Photo ops are plentiful there with choices ranging from picturesque long-tail boats to most interesting people living in hilliop tribal villages. This is where the "longneck" women, as well as other interesting people, make their homes. By the way, the people in Thailand are very friendly and cooperative especially when it comes to having their pictures taken. Here you'll want a telephoto lens so you can move in tight and capture all the character in faces. An 85mm to 200mm lens will do fine.

Moving south, we stopped at Chiang Mai, Thailand's sec-ond largest city. Here great scenery abounds and we began to see rice paddy work-ers and some amazing Wats

(temples). Further south, we spent Cempies).

Further south, we spent some time photographing Sukbothai, a grouping of temples from ancient times. Here you'll want a wide-angle lens to get more in the viewfinder and take advantage of the increased depth-of-field afforded by wide-angles. Next on the litherary was Phuket and surroundings, Thailand's southern islands. Coastal scenes including palm trees and other tropical subjects mailty our camera. As in all travel photography, pack camera equipment light-ly, but wisely. You'll want lens-es from 28mm to 200mm which can easily be accommodated in one good zoom lens. 200 ASA film should get you by and remember, NEVER place film in checked luggage...t will be ruined! Use lead bags, or better still, ask for visual inspections at security stations. The new TSA inspectors are very coop-

entive.

Don't leave that triped home. A light-weight, yet sturdy one is easy to pack and you'll be glad you took it.

He will by the horns, and head for a career on Wall Street. Five years later, sure enough, hes trading U.S. Treasury bonds, and starting to make a showing.

But so, too, has his downfall.
If you're looking to get acquainted with Wall Street and its ways in the closing days of the twentieth century, you could do worse than this fast-moving, well-observed novel by former Michigan author, Sout Lasser ("Battle Creek"). By books end, you can see the place, hear the place, we manel the trading floor itself: "It's a faith to the musty door, one heated by all the electronics; it smells as if an electric oven has been turned on that hasn't been used in years. Later in the trading day, it will take on the stench of a locker room."

But it's certainly not just the exciting, hard-driving back-drop that brings All I Could Get alive. Lasses's characters-and most especially, his protag-onter - are what really virily this thought-provoking tale of love, lust, loss, and living. Though it's a little murky as to why Barry accupiers such hard-driving ambition suddenly (we're only told that he has 'had enough' of his old life'), we soon find ourselves caught up with

find ourselves caught up with him and his family in his new

him and his faun; or accepted.

And even if some of us may not understand much about equity markets, long bonds, or debt issuance, we quickly identify with this well-meaning guy who drives shoeless, still loves Led Zep, and yearns for the days when his favorite team from childhood - the Detroit Tigers - were world chamnions.

After all, this young man is only trying to 'get alread,' only attempting to up the standard of living for himself and his familiat, once he's stashed some cash, they'll all head back home, and life will be as it always was - only better.)

ause of our close identifica tion with Barry, we may squirm a bit when one of the players in

this drama says, "success creates an ever-deepening need." Slowly, we watch Barry's ambi-

Slowly, we watch Barry's ambi-tion turn to greed. And then this greed becomes a kind of disease—an insidious malady that ents away at the edges of human decency, a chronic failure of the heart manifested by spiritual blindness and deathers to the needs of those we hove the most. Barry Schwartz – this gny we liked, this gny we were cheeting for – in the course of getting shead, manages to turn his back, in one way or another, or every single person he cares about, until it may be much too late.

My only quibble with this book is a certain built-in difficulty with the lings of Wall Street. Because of this, I'm a little lors at certain points, and Lasser doesn't make any elaborate efforts to fill me in. Overall, his doesn't actually make a lot of difference in the novel's impact, however. When I finished All I Could Get. I felt much like It divisited Wall Street, and, in the process, perhaps glimpsed a little corner of hell steef.
