points. Bloomfield Hills Lahser (37) and Troy Athens (30) rounded out the team scores.

Raiders coach Bill Pinnell said he would have been happy with two to four dual-meet wins, and maybe a middle-of-the-pack finish in his team's first season in the OAA. But the Raiders strong finish made him very pleased and excited about future prospects.

"We had some freshmen really step up for us," he said. "Our throwers came in and did a nice job at the league meet, and as it turned out, every point we got helped a lot in our finish."

Olivia Swinger and Eve Davidson took fourth and fifth respectively in the discus. Jaya Muldrew again figured in much of the team's point scoring as well. She was fourth in the long jump (15-1) and was part of the team's 800 relay (second, 1:56.6), and 400 relay (fourth, 56.7).

The 3,200 relay team of Amy Miller, Bradie MacDonald, Susan Barrows and Katie Milan finished third with a time of 10:50.7.

Other individual finishers included Miller and MacDonald in the 800, Barrows and Milan in the 3,200 and Barrows in the 1,600.

Hawks are 4th in Division I

Farmington Harrison's boys and girls teams finished fourth in the OAA Division I meets at Lake Orion with 54 and 57 points, respectively.

Standouts in the girls meet included Krystal Wise, who won the 100 dash, and Kacy Winans, who was second in the 100 hurdles and third in the 300 hurdles.

Both were on the second-place 400 relay team that included Natalie Donoho-

Adams and Jessi Drew. Taurin Dew was third in the shot put and fourth in the discus, and Amber Brown was fourth in the high jump and 300 hurdles.

"I thought we did some really good things, but we also had a little bit of a letdown after the regional on Friday," coach Mark Babcock said.

"We didn't handle the baton real well, but we did some things well, too. Krystal Wise did a great job, and Kacy Winans set another school record."

Winans' time of 15.2 in the 100 hurdles broke her own record of 15.4, which she set Friday in the regional.

Tate leads Harrison effort

Harrison's Fermon Tate won the 400 dash and Kevin Davis was second in the high hurdles in the Division I boys meet.

Robert McCall, Charles Pickett and Charles Stewart combined with Tate to win the 800 relay and with Davis to finish the 400 relay.

"I thought we did pretty well," coach John Reed said. "We held a couple guys out of the meet, and we have honors night Tuesday, also."

"You can't do everything in life. Academics are more important than track. We did well but we'll have a full team together for the next two meets (county and state)."

Marcus Woods and Brian Coats didn't run due to the cold weather and nagging injuries. Davis left midway in the meet to attend the honors program and didn't run the 300 hurdles.

"We were trying to balance awards and keeping kids healthy for the state meet," Reed said.

The Hawks will go to the Division II state meet May 31 as two-time defending champions.

"Basically, we're in the same position we were last year,"

Reed said. "We have 11 kids qualified in 10 events, which is more than last year."

"On paper, we look solid. We just have to go there and perform well and see what happens. We definitely have a good chance to do well at that meet."

North boys place 5th in DII

North Farmington was fifth in the OAA Division II boys meet with 49 points. Southfield won the division title.

Eugene Furman had the Raiders' best finish, taking second in the 800 run (2:03.9). He also anchored the distance relay teams that scored points.

The Raiders had third places from Ashwin Raghu in the 300 hurdles (43.8), Anthony Gatling in the 200 dash (23.5) and Kyle Goldman in the shot put (49-0).

Jason Zeldes, Marcus Thornton and Gatling comprised three quarters of the third-place 400 and 800 relays. Demetrius Milhouse was the lead runner in the 400 (45.4) and Tony DiVito in the 800 (1:36.8).

The 3,200 relay team of Jeff Mataya, Samit Patrawala, Steve Gannon and Furman was fourth (8:42.4), and Safet Cunmulaj was fifth in the discus (126-9).

Will Hathaway was sixth in the discus (125-3) and shot put (49-5), and Matt McManus was sixth in the high hurdles (17-3). Garrett Lewis, Carl Nance, Bill Thomas and Furman finished sixth in the 1,600 relay (3:43.8), too.

"I was a little disappointed after our regional performance, just in some of the heart and desire the kids showed," coach Jeff Simpson said.

"I challenged them going into the division meet. I thought they performed much better and were more focused. They responded well, and that was good to see."
