Library sells \$1 million in bonds to cover costs

The Farmington Community Library sold \$1 million in bonds last week to cover cost overruns for the addition and remodeling of its 12 Mile branch. The final bill for the work was \$16 million, said Library Director Bev

Papal.
The library originally sold \$12 million in bonds to fund the project.

Additional funds for library improve-ments, including construction, were reserved through a .6 mill tax increase approved by voters in 1998 and interest

income.

The latest bond offering was sold at 2.8 percent interest and will be paid off the same time as the original bond, in 2013, said Papai.

She said the final cost overrun was because of some things that were planned and others that were not,

including a second firewall ordered by the fire marshal.

"We ended up making decisions that ended up costing money and dealing with surprises," also said.

Ground problems, weather and some "hidden conditions" on the construction site (adjacent to the existing library) added to the cost. Also, the library board of trustees in summer 2001 decided to expand the children's area in the lower level and eliminate a third




