In other Bucks' news, despite their strong start the team had been ignored when PDL officials made their first five selections of the Team of the Week, which consisted of the top 11 players from the 51 PDL teams.

we were capable of this kind of season," he said. "We always have high expectations, but the pressure was on because teams were always gunning for us. But the kids really handled the pressure well and I'm very proud of them."
Cranbrook Kingswood pressured Brother Rice through the game's first 16 minutes. The Warriors scored first, but the Cranes came through with two straight goals by midfielder Garrett Hohendorf and held a 2-1 lead with eight minutes to go before the break.
Then the Warriors went to work.
Brother Rice countered with four quick goals and took a 5-2 halftime advantage. The Warriors then scored the first five goals of the second half to take control with a 10-2 lead.
Cranbrook Kingswood, which won the 1995 championship in its last state-title game appearance, made it close by scoring three times in the

game's final two minutes against most of Rice's reserves.
Hohendorf finished with three goals while Andy China and Steven Schimpke also scored for the Cranes.
"We had to hope that we could maintain ball possession, and that didn't happen," said Cranbrook Kingswood coach Ron Hebert, whose team ended the season with a 15-7 record. "We wanted to try and make it a short game because I knew we couldn't play at their level for the entire game."
"We were trying to push it, hoping to get a couple of transition things," he said. "But they're so good. They started winning every face off and controlled the ball. They're just a much better team."
Brother Rice was led by sophomore Steve Walters - in his first year of varsity lacrosse - who registered a team-high four goals. Veteran midfielder Joe Landry scored three times, while seniors Jimmy Gregg, Charlie Heid and Jeff Stachowiak accounted for the other tallies. Brian Mahler had three assists.

Junior goalie Marco Rea faced only four shots in the first half and picked up the win.
Ambrose credited Rice's senior leadership with its record-setting victory success this year.
Besides Landry, Gregg, Heid, Mahler and Stachowiak, Rice's other seniors include Pat Smith, David Himrod, Will Clugston, Ryan Brittain, Mark Pytko and Chris Peterson.
"The seniors have been playing together since their freshman years, and a lot of them have been playing varsity since they were freshmen," said Ambrose. "That's where that experience on the field comes into play. We expect them to make the plays when the going gets tough."
"The senior leadership has been excellent and I'm really happy for the seniors because they're a bunch of really good kids," he said.
