Chayka also collects specialty geraniums, such as one with chartreuse foliage. A zonal geranium has a brocade leaf, quite pretty. Thus her business name, The Scented Geranium.

HEIGHTS AND HYDRANGEAS

Some plants add height, such as the tall pine trees, viburmum, a carriessi which has extra fragant blooms in early spring with soft pink flowers and are followed by red fruit in the fall. A leather-leaf wiburmum has learse with viburmum has large white blooms and produces red fruit in the fall. Its leather-like,



wrinkled leaves give it its name. Several hydrangeas such as Annabelle are added to this delicious mix of plants. It has 'big, white pom pom flowers,' An oak-leaf hydrangea pro-duces late-spring flowers; the


