After more than six years of hoping for a buby, the wishes of Carol and Sanjay Sethi were answered fourfold March 12 at Hutzel Hospital in Detroit when the babies — Elizabeth, Catherine, Gabrielle and Collu,

were born a minute apart by emergency Cesarean section. They were preemies because Carolis due date was the week of May 19.

"I had a general anesthetic and it was about 36 hours before I saw them," said Carol, who teaches in Farmington Public School.

Cuddle time is all day long for the Sethi quadruplets, who nestle cradicel in their parents and grandparents arms. At birth, their weights ranged from 2,4 to 2,8 pounds. Carol uses a calculator to translate, because she usually remembecause she usually remem-

because she usually remembers them in grauns.

The finternal babies, born from four different eggs, came after Carol used the drug Follistum dispensed through injections by Dr. Marjorie Treadwell a short time after consulting with her. Just one cycle cost \$2,000.

They did one treatment, Carol said. "By seven weeks we knew I was pregnant with four. It's awesome but at the same time it's scare."

The Sethis, both 35, have built-in help because they live with Sanjay's parents, Satish and Usha Sethi, in the home they built together seven years

ago. This will be especially helpful when Carol returns to her full-time job in August as stath grade teacher at East Middle School.

Sarjay, an oriental rug salesman, works at the Marshall Fields store at Northland Mail in Southfield. Saajay hired Carol at Westland Mail.

"Little did he know he hired me fur Hig." Carol said.

Carol's parents, William and Frances Mouchet of Spring Hill, Fla., are also assisting with an extended visit.

The quads are the first multiple births on both sides of the family.

The bassinets are color coded, Carol said. "We color code everything."

That includes their charts and binkies or pacifiers.

The quads took their first trip out in double strollers May 28, cruising around their 14 Mile and Haggerty neighborhood.

Their personalities have changed, Carol said. Gabrielle had the most health issues and is on theophylline, a bronchodilator. She is the most sensitive and perceptive of her surroundings, Carol said.
