For your convenience, a depositary is located in the City Hall lobby.

Applications for deferment of 2003 taxes are available at the City of Farmington Treasurer's office. If your income for 2002 did not exceed \$25,000 and you are a single person, a widow, or a totally or permanently disabled, your application must be filed with the City of Farmington Treasurer's office no later than September 16, 2003. Deferment Summer Taxes may be paid without penalty until February 25, 2004.

By law, if the last day for payment falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, the last day will be extended to include the next day which is not a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday.
