Arbors stand tall throughout the yard. There's two iron arbors, two wooden ones created by husband Myrl, another wood one with iya and euonymous made by Mikolon. Two arches are on the back of the house.

The garden is a focal point of her life and helps her in maintaining her health. 'It keeps me hopeful and positive,' Levies said.


