Past president Michael Munson presented the past presidents ring to Jim Lhamon, who did a remarkable and steadfast job during his term in office.

The women's and men's city tournament champions were awarded with engraved mementos, while the All-City teams were given embroidered team jackets.

The DWBA Agnes Eckstrom Memorial Award went to Rosetta Williams for her 161 pins over average (series) in the city tournament.

This year's Queen was Altramese (Mickey) Webb with

a 225.2 composite average. The Queen's Court consisted of Tamika Glenn of Farmington Hills with a 224.1 composite average and Veronica Tubbs with 217.1.

Livonia's Mary Mohaci earned high honors by being selected Woman of the Year, while Phyllis Jordan was recognized as Secretary of the Year.

The GDBA awarded the first- and second-team All-City teams and the Senior All-City squad.

Hall-of-famer Tony Lindemann was given the Bowlers Achievement Award, while Jarvis Woeilke, who is four score and 10 years in age, was handed the plaque for meritorious service.

Jarvis Woeilke of Dearborn is another whole story, one of a select group and very few still living who knew Henry Ford personally.

Mr. Ford would often see young Jarvis walking to school and give him a lift the rest of the way.

They became good friends and Ford would sometimes appear at the Woeilke residence, just on down the road and visit with the family.

Jarvis might have easily gone to work for Ford Motor Co., but he followed his dream to be a fireman and is now retired from the Dearborn Fire Department.

His wife, Ida, has always been there for her man, fully supportive and loving for all these years. And what more could a man ask for but to have made friends with Henry Ford, and enjoy a long and loving marriage.
