Mrs. Charles Damon and Mrs. J. Schultze spent Tuesday afternoon with Mrs. Albert Koss on Base Line road.

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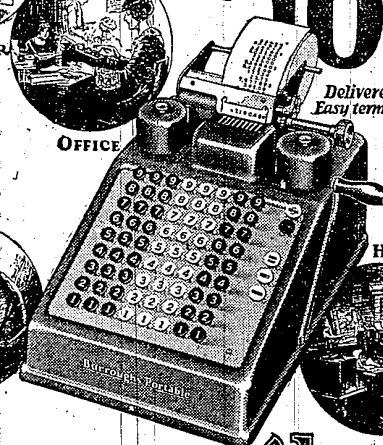
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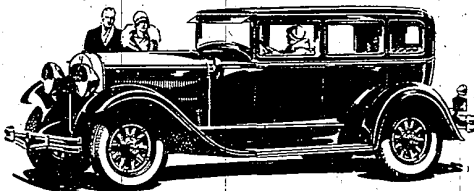
