

CHEVROLET PRODUCTION  
RECORDS ARE BROKEN

All monthly production records in the history of the Chevrolet Motor Company were broken in March, when the company produced 147,274 cars and trucks.

This March record compares with 133,637 units for March of last year and with 121,249 for February of this year. It exceeded by nearly 7,000 units the best previous month in the history of the company, which was May, 1928, when output totaled 140,775 units.

The March performance enabled the company to exceed all records for the first quarter of the year, with a total of 354,701 units as compared with 342,484 for the first three months of 1928.

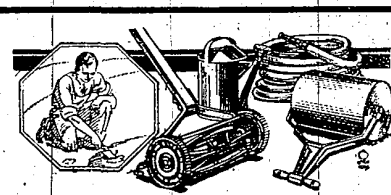
