Regular meeting of the Commissioners of the City of Farmington, held May 6, 1929.  
 Commissioners present, Hatten, Hogle, Otis, Staman and Gilde-meister.  
 Called to order by Mayor Lamb at 7:30 p. m.  
 Minutes of the meeting of April 18 and April 25 read and approved.

Motion made by Otis, seconded by Hatten that we purchase a car load of oil from the Standard Oil Co. at the price agreed upon, 5.90 cents per gallon, delivered to the D. U. R. at Greenfield. Carried.  
 Motion made by Hogle, seconded by Hatten that an endowment fund for cemeteries be established and that the Two Hundred Dollars received from the Angelina Lapham estate and the Fifty Dollars received from Mrs. David Ross be placed on record. Carried.  
 A committee from the Woman's Club addressed the Commissioners in regard to the dangerous condition of Shivassee street, caused by the caving of the creek bank. Referred to the street committee. They also spoke of the necessity of smoke screens upon some of the down town buildings. Attention will be given this matter by the City officials.  
 Motion made by Hogle, seconded by Otis, that the City Clerk write to E. L. Mills at Northville asking that Farmington City be numbered in accord with the Detroit Edison plan. Carried.  
 The protest of Charles Pettibone in regard to his water bill was referred to the water commissioner.  
 Mayor Lamb appointed Gilde-meister, Hatten and Hogle a committee to take up the matter of locating an aeroplane factory in or near the city.  
 John Mahaney turned in his Farmington fire department badge.  
 Mayor Lamb appointed Harold Oldenburg, Meredith Steeb, and Howard Osmus firemen.
