# WAR VETERANS URGED TO FILE BONUS CLAIMS

The following message is ad-dressed to World War veterans and survivors of deceased veter-ans by Congressman Grant M. Hudson:

Approximately 400,000 veterans
of the World War have failed to
file application for Adjusted Service Certificate commonly known
as the Bonus.
The time within for these
application will expire during this
year.

All enlisted men who served more than sixty days are entitled to the Bonus, dependent on the length of service.

Veterans who have not filed application should do so now. If a veteran dide either before or since the enactment of this law without making application, then the widowlor children or the dependin mother or father of the veteran may do so now.

These applications must be filed, however, shon, or it will be too late. I am anxious that all parties residing within the Sixth Congressional District, which I represent, may not be barred from making claim by reasen of limitation.
