

Student Council Makes Donation To Center Drive

East Junior High School's Student Council voted Monday to contribute \$50 to the Farmington Community Center campaign. The students feel that central location for youth activities would be a community asset, according to Roy Danley, administrative intern at the school.

If enough money is raised,

the center will be established in the Goodenough home at 24705 Farmington Rd. Heirs of Luman Goodenough (Mrs. Eleanor G. Spicer, Mrs. George Schenck and Daniel W. Goodenough) have offered the residence to Farmington if enough money is raised to put the house in suitable condition and to operate it as a center for one

year. The estimated cost is placed at \$60,000. To other action, the Student Council approved the adoption of a foster child. He is an American Indian boy who lives in Arizona. The adoptive "parents" are looking forward to receiving a picture and the name of their child.

The council also made plans for its second annual clothing drive to be made this week. Last year several tons of clothing were collected and distributed throughout the greater Detroit area. Women of the First Presbyterian Church delivered jackets and shoes to needy persons in the Farmington community.
