The Karolyis Get In

The United States decides that it will not be defiled or menaced if it permits Count and Counters Karolyi to visit this country. This decision is voiced by Henry L. Stimson, secretary of state, and is contrary to the decisions of his immediate predecessor, Mr. Kellogg

Karolyi was president of Hun-gary immediately after the collapse of the Austro-Hungarian empire at the end of the World War. Both count and countess are permenant exiles because of the enmity of the reactionary Horthy regime. They have been branded as dangerous radicals. As a matter of fact they are charming people and very far renoved from the agitator class.

Their exclusion may have been due to a desire to please the Hungarian regency or it may have been caused by a mis enthusiasm to protect American minds from perilous radicalism, Whatever the motive it was a foolish mistake. Secretary Stimson has sanely and sensibly recti-fied it.—Cleveland Plain-Dealer.
