noon. Mrs. L. J. Hamill and Mrs. Charles Collins were awarded prizes.

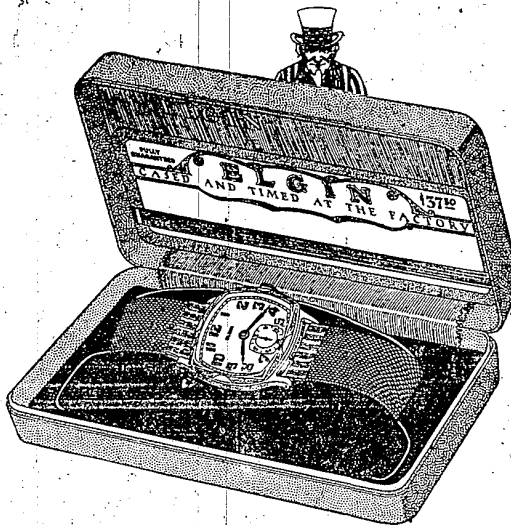

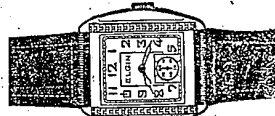
