## INFANTRY OF U. S. ARMY IS BEING MOTORIZED

Motorization of infantry is being effected generally at this time in the armies of the world and the United States army is at present conducting its fifth experiment along this line at Camp Eustis, Lee Hall, Va.

It is the 34th infantry that no longer has to hike with the slow military tread, riding instead in a fleet of 66 Chevrolet passenger cars and trucks. Extensive maneuvers which have been conducted since last August have proved so successful that indications point to complete motorization of the army within the next few years.

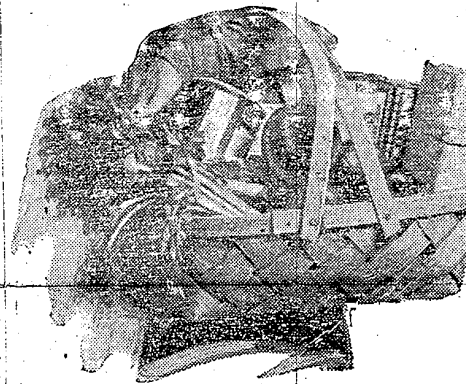

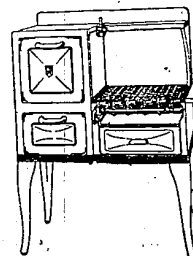
