### 359 CHILDREN KILLED IN YEAR IN MICHIGAN

Sixty children were killed in  
September and 359 in nine  
months in Michigan. Of the number  
killed in nine months 72 were  
killed by railroad trains and 20  
in collision with street cars.

Of the sixteen counties having  
more than 15 fatalities that there  
were only three that had a reduction,  
while one duplicated the  
1923 record. Eleven had increases  
the most outstanding being Monroe  
County, where eight were  
killed by their automobile colliding  
with railroad trains.


OUR Pilgrim fathers were
