**MODERATE APPLICATION OF BRAKES ADVISABLE**

"Some motor-car drivers make it a practice to use the brakes to their full power for every stop. That is, they maintain speed to the last possible moment even when they know long in advance that they must come to a standstill, and then bring the car to a sudden halt."

"It is a great advantage to have the ability to make sudden stops in emergencies, but it is a gross abuse of a car to use this power harshly every time."

"Drivers should use their brakes moderately for all service stops. When they see a red light a block ahead, they should let the car slow down gradually, bringing it to a standstill finally with gentle brake pressure."

"This practice, if followed reg-

ularly, not only saves the tires and brake linings, but guards the whole chassis from undue stresses."

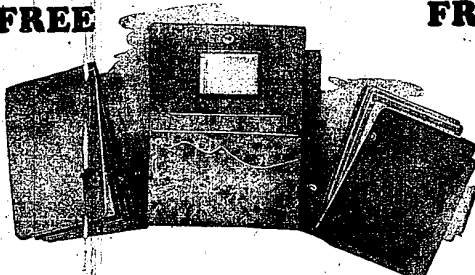

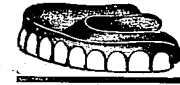
