## STATEMENT

TO THE PEOPLE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON, IN REGARD TO THE ROAD REPAIR FUND:

During my term of office as Highway Commissioner of Farmington Township, the following money was appropriated for road repairs. Also a comparison is made with the amount which was allowed last year.

This drastic cut which in district Four amounted to almost one half was made in the road appropriation so that the Township might reduce the large overdraft which it has been obliged to carry yearly, to meet expenses in lieu of unpaid taxes.

So while this cut has been beneficial to the Township in reducing the interest which a larger overdraft would have taken, it has kept the highway commissioner from spreading the amount of gravel that has been spread in other years.

Therefore, we have spread 4,200 yards of gravel at \$1.65 per yard, throughout the Township during the past year.
