To determine which is the right and left sleeve after cutting out the material, fold the sleeve through the center lengthwise with the sleeve scam edges together. If one side of the sleeve is only slightly higher than the other and the top curve of the front and back lie in the same general direction, the high side is the back. At the lower end, too, the back will extend beyond the front.
