FIRE CHIEF IN OAKLAND EIGHT SETS A RECORD

The driving skill of a fire department chief and the speed of an Oakland Eight recently were combined to decrease the elapsed time on the 1609-mile road route between North Adams, Mass and Miami, Fla. to 35 hours and 55 minutes at an average of 44.5 miles per hour.

The record time was established despite careful observance of speed and traffic laws, a punctured tire, regular stops for meals and gasoline and the fact that the driver became lost in a tangle of roads somewhere north of Washington.

The fire chief motorist was John E. Saulneir of North Adams. He was accompanied by Nelson S. McGraw and Valmore Monette, also of North Adams, who served as relief drivers. That the relief pilots maintained a smart pace may be judged from McGraw's time on one stretch of 300 miles which he made in five hours flat. The Oakland was on the road during 33 hours of the total elapsed time which increases the actual speed to an average of nearly 49 miles per hour.
