

J. ALBERT DECKER, AGE 84,
DIES AFTER LONG ILLNESS

The funeral of J. Albert Decker, age 84, was held at Pontiac on Thursday with burial in Walled Lake Cemetery. The deceased who had been in ill health for a number of years died of heart trouble at a Pontiac hospital on Monday, where he had been taken on the Thursday preceding. Mr. Decker, who spent most of his life at Walled Lake was born in Lima, O., on March 14, 1846. He came to Michigan with his parents two years later and had lived in Oakland County since. He was married in 1874, his wife dying in 1918. He moved to Pontiac 13 years ago where he lived with his daughter, Bertha Decker, who survives, also one other daughter, Mrs. Belle Hosner of Pontiac, two granddaughters, Marie McVicar of Detroit, and Denise Hosner of Pontiac. He is also survived by a brother, Mark Decker of Wixom and one sister, Mrs. Mary Howard of Pontiac.

RULE ON TUITION
IS ADOPTED BY
EDUCATION BOARD

No Refund To Be Allowed After Pupil Attends Two Weeks, Is Decision

A decision which is expected to avoid further questions between the Farmington Board of Education and the boards of districts which send pupils to Farmington schools was made by the Farmington Board at its regular meeting Wednesday evening.

Questions have arisen in regard to tuition, in cases in which students have attended school during part of a semester only. The Board voted to allow no refunds of tuition when the student has attended two weeks of school in either semester.

Several recent "border-line" cases have made decisions difficult for the Board in endeavoring to treat all of the outside districts alike. The rule is effective beginning with the opening of school in September.

The meeting, the last regular session of the present Board, was held Wednesday evening instead of on Thursday, due to the honor banquet.
