held Monday, July 21, to amend the Charter of the City of Farmington as follows: RESOLVED: That the Charter of the City of Farmington as adopted on February 18th, 1926 be amended as follows: Section 25, under Finance and Taxation which reads as follows: The Commission is hereby prohibited except as herein otherwise provided, from borrowing any money, or authorizing the creation of any liability or indebtedness against the City, in any one year, exceeding in the aggregate the, amount of one-half of one per cent of the assessed valuation of the property of, the City; nor shall it be lawful to create an indebtedness from time to time to exceed five per cent of the then assessed valuation of the property of the City; To be changed to read as follows:

Section 25. The Commission is

hereby prohibited, except as herein otherwise provided, from boxrowing any money or authorizing,
the creation of any liability of indebtedness against the City, in
any one year, exceeding in the
aggregate the amount of two per
cent of the assessed valuation of

the property in said City, nor shall it be lawful for said City to ever create an indebtedness existing from time to time to exceed ten per cent of the assessed valuation of the property of

valuation of the property of the preceding year;

And a new paragraph to be added to read as follows:

25-A. "The City Commission may borrow money on the credit of the City and issue bonds therefore in a sum not to exceed ten per cent of the assessed value of the real and personal property for the purpose of purchasing parks and public grounds and the construction and the erection of all public buildings, libraries, hos pitals, almshouses, electric light, gas, water and power plants and other public utilities, bridges, sewers and any other public works authorized by this Charter, provided that at no time shall the bonded indebtedness of the City exceed ten per cent of the assessed valuation of all real and personal property in the City."


