

ANNUAL SCHOOL STATEMENT SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 5, CITY AND TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON

The annual meeting of School District No. 5 City and Township of Farmington was held July 14, 1930 at the High School.

The meeting was called to order by President Blanche W. Ross at 8:15. Minutes of the preceding annual meeting read by the Secretary. Minutes accepted as read. Financial report for year read and accepted. John Thayer, Floyd Nichols and Howard Warner were appointed as tellers by the President. John Thayer read the law pertaining to qualifications of voters.

Nominations called for to fill first vacancy caused by the expiration of the term of Arthur Lamb. Carl Goers was nominated by E. A. Flink.

Arthur Lamb was nominated by Miss Helen Hard and A. L. Ross by E. W. Lester. A. L. Ross withdrew his name. A motion was made by Mark Wixon that the nominations be closed. The motion was supported and carried. The results of the first ballot were, 217 votes cast of which Arthur Lamb received 125 and Carl Goers 92. Arthur Lamb was declared elected.

Nominations were called for to fill the second vacancy. A. L. Ross was nominated by N. H. Power. A motion was made by Allen W. Nelson that the nominations be closed. The motion was supported and carried.

A motion was made by Allen W. Nelson that the Secretary be instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for A. L. Ross. The President stated that the motion was illegal and the vote must be by written ballot. The results of the second ballot were as follows: 163 votes cast of which A. L. Ross received 145; Carl Goers 8, Dr. E. F. Holcomb 9, and Ben Meyers 1. A. L. Ross was declared elected.

The following resolution was presented to the electors by Floyd Nichols.

"It is hereby resolved that in the future School District No. 5, Farmington City and Township adopt the provisions of Chapter 7 of Part 2 of General School Law (Revision 1927), relative to the manner of nomination and election of members of the Board of Education."

Hyman Levinson read an explanation of the method of changing the election. Allen Nelson supported the motion to adopt the resolution as read by Floyd Nichols. The motion was carried.

A motion to adjourn was made by Floyd Nichols and supported by John Thayer. Motion carried and meeting adjourned.

Notice of Special Assessment for Water Mains

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a meeting of the Township Board of the Township of Livonia, Wayne County, Michigan will be held on Wednesday, the 27th day of August, A. D. 1930, at eight o'clock P. M. at the Township Hall for the purpose of considering objections to the proposed water mains in the territory of said Township as described in the annexed resolution, in said Township and also the purpose of considering any objections to the making of a special assessment upon all of the land described in the annexed resolution. In said Township, to defray the cost and expense of installation of said water mains, all as more particularly set forth in a resolution of the Township Board of the Township of Livonia, Michigan, adopted at a meeting thereof held July 12, 1930, of which the following is a true copy:

WHEREAS, a section has been filed with the Township Board of the Township of Livonia, Wayne County, Michigan, verified both as to its accuracy and ownership by more than sixty (60) parties, the owners of the plat; lands to be made special assessment district for the purpose of paying the cost of the installation and extension of water mains in the territory of said Township, said water mains to provide for fire protection and domestic use, and acreage that the cost of said improvement shall be paid by a special assessment to be levied upon the lands constituting a special assessment district.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that it is the opinion of the Township Board that the premises hereinafter described will be benefited by said improvement and it is the intention of the Township Board to assess said lands and premises for the costs of said improvement.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Township Board of Livonia meet on Wednesday the 27th day of August, A. D. 1930, at 8 o'clock P. M., at the Township Hall, in the Township of Livonia, Michigan, to consider any objections to said improvement and to give notice of said meeting by posting notices thereof at least ten days preceding the time of said meeting in three public places in the Township of Livonia, and there being no newspaper published in the Township of Livonia, a legal publication cannot be made on a newspaper notice; however, a notice shall be published in one issue of the Farmington Enterprise.
