The annual meeting of School District No. 5 City and Township of Farmington was held July 14, 1930 at the High School.

The meeting was called to order by President Blanche W. Roos at 8:15. Minutes of the preceding annual meeting read by the Secretary. Minutes accepted as read. Financial report for year read and accepted. John Thayer, Floyd Nichols and Howard Warner were appointed as tellers by the President. John Thayer read the law pertaining to qualifications of voters.

Nominations called for to full first vacancy caused by the expiration of the term of Arthur Lamb. Carl Goers was nominated by E. A. Fluk. Arthur Lamb was nominated by Miss Helen Hard and A. L. Ross by E. W. Lester. A. L. Ross witherew his name. A motion was supported and carried. The results of the first ballot were, 217 votes cast of which Arthur Lamb was declared elected.

Nominations were called for to fill the second vacancy. A. L. Ross was nominated by N. H. Power. A motion was made by Allen W. Nelson that the nominations be closed. The motion was supported and carried.

A motion was made by Allen W. Nelson that the secretary be instructed to cast a unanimous ballot believed.

A motion was made by Allen W. Nelson that the Secretary be instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for A. L. Ross. The President stated that the motion was illegal and the vote must be by written ballot. The results of the second ballot were as follows: 163 votes cast of which A. L. Ross received 145: Carl Goers S. Dr. E. F. Holcomb 9, and Ben Meyers I. A. L. Ross was declared elected.

The following resolution was presented to the electors by Floyd Nichols.

"It is hereby resolved that in the future School District No. 5. Farmington City and Township adopt the provisions of Chapter 7 of Part 2 of General School Law (Revision 1927). retaitive to the manner of nominations and election of members of the Board of Education."

Hymna Levinson read an explanation of the method of changing the election. Allen Nelson supported the motion to adopt the resolution as read by Floyd Nichols. The motion was carried.
