

# District No. 6 Annual Report

## ANNUAL SCHOOL STATEMENT SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 6, FARMINGTON TOWNSHIP

Annual Report Year Ended June 30, 1930  
The annual meeting of the above school district was held in the William Grace School on Monday July 14, 1930. The meeting was called to order by the President about 8:25 P. M. The minutes of the previous annual meeting were read by the Secretary, followed by the reading of the Treasurer's report by the treasurer. Motion made by Mr. Schoenberger, seconded by Mr. Hoffman that the minutes and report be accepted as read, carried. The following were then appointed tellers; Charles Noble, J. C. Spaulding and Mrs. Vanderburgh. Miss M. Noble was nominated by Mr. Hoffman and seconded by Mrs. Hoffman for election to the board. F. Wilkinson was then nominated by Mr. R. A. Oldham, seconded by Mrs. Schoenberger. Mr. Werschen moved that nominations be closed, this was seconded by Miss Noble. The result of the voting was Miss Noble 25 and F. Wilkinson 17. Total votes cast being 42. Miss Noble elected to the board.

Mr. J. C. Erwin was then nominated by Miss Noble, seconded by Mr. Currie. Mr. Werschen moved that nominations be closed this was seconded by Mr. Currie. Voting being as follows: Ayes, 26; No's 2. Blank 7. Spoiled 1. Total votes cast 36. Mr. Erwin elected to the board.

The following nominations then took place: Mrs. H. Gregor nominated by Mr. Casa, seconded by Wm. Currie. Mr. C. Smith nominated by Mrs. Gregor seconded by Mrs. Schoenberger. Mrs. Bramer nominated by Miss Noble seconded by Mrs. Stockwell. Mr. Hoffman nominated by Mr. Werschen seconded by Mrs. Gregor. Voting being as follows: Mrs. Gregor 17, Mr. Smith 3, Mrs. Bramer 9 and Mr. Hoffman 13. Total votes cast 42. Mrs. Gregor elected to the board.

Motion made by F. Wilkinson, seconded by Miss Noble that a detailed audit of the accounts be made from the date of the last audit to June 30, 1930 by a firm of Certified Public Accountants. Voting, Ayes 4, No. 24. Total votes cast 28. Motion did not carry.

Motion made by Mr. Werschen, seconded by Mrs. Schoenberger to continue with a ten months school. Voting Ayes 17, No 12. Total votes cast 29, carried. Motion to adjourn made by Mr. Oldham seconded by Mrs. Schoenberger, carried.
