### FORMER PRESIDENT OF BIRMINGHAM FOR LEGISLATURE

Birmingham Man Enters Contest For State Representative Nomination

H. T. Ellerby, former president of Birmingham, announced this week his entrance into the race



for State Representative from this district on the Republican ticket. Petitions have been circulated for him in every section of eastern and southern Oakland County. Strong support is being marshalled in his behalf, and a lively contest is expected as September 9, the primary election date, draws near.

Mr. Ellerby is 42 years old, married and has three children. He was educated at Syracuse University where he graduated from the law college in 1910, shortly afterwards entering the employ of a large eastern insurance company and has been continuously associated with them. He is now engaged in the conduct of a general insurance business in Detroit and Birmingham. He is a trustee of the Birmingham First Methodist church, and the immediate past-president of the Birmingham Exchange Club.

Makes Statement  
Mr. Ellerby made the following statement regarding his candidacy:

"For many years I have been interested in social and economic subjects and, because of certain matters likely to come before the next Legislature, I would appreciate the opportunity of representing Oakland County at this time. The question of reapportionment and redistricting for purposes of representation in both Congress and the State Legislature will be an active subject for discussion in which Oakland County, with its continued change from a farming to a residential and industrial community, will be particularly interested.

"Certainly we should concern ourselves over the question of taxation and the burden that Oakland County is called upon to bear in State expenses, and all matters of expenditure of State funds very quickly and rather drastically affects Oakland County. There is an attitude on the part of certain interests to present some type of compulsory automobile insurance for adoption by the next Legislature and, because of the experience of several other states, careful study by competent authorities must be given to such legislation for in many states serious mistakes have been made in this type of legislation.

"I hope, before the time of the primaries, to be able to discuss with a great many of the residents of this district not only these propositions to which I have referred, but also the subject of a sales or income tax, prohibition and its enforcement, capital punishment and the expenditure of public monies for improvements, all of which subjects are likely to create much discussion in the coming Legislature.
