PROCEEDINGS OF ANNUAL MEETING AND ITEMIZED FINANCIAL REPORT, DISTRICT NO 5 FRACTIONAL, FARMINGTON, LIVONIA AND REDFORD TOWNSHIPS.

Mr. Lahr declared elected.

Officers salaries. Motion by Mr. Hallock, supported by Mr. Billings that officers' salaries remain the same. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Kaldor, supported by Mr. Thornton that excess tuition be paid to eligible high schools in Michigan. Motion carried.

Resolved that school term remain the same and that we furnish free text books.

Motion by Mr. Kaldor, supported by Mr. Heise, that depository remain the same for the ensuing year. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Billings, supported by Mr. Heise that 8 o'clock p. m. will be the time set for the next annual meeting.

Motion by Mr. Hallock, supported by Mr. Sauve that meeting adjourn.
