## Chevrolet Produces More Light Trucks

An increase of 20 per cent in production of light delivery trucks during the first half of this year over the same period in 1929 has been announced today by Sidney Corbett, manager of the commercial car division of the Chevrolet Motor Company.

Figures for the comparable periods were 27,286 units as against 22,613 to July 1 last year. This production increase Mr. Corbett attributes to the need for light delivery trucks in federal, state, municipal and public utility construction projects now under way, and to the growing use of the light truck in rural sections. Farmers, especially, are finding the light delivery an economical and necessary addition to farm equipment, he said, and the wide variety of body types available enables the user to choose the exact body for the work to be done.
