Commissioner Gildemeister made a report on the J. J. Webster sidewalk on Liberty street. Crosswalk will be laid on Liberty street to State street to temporarily take care of the situation.

Commissioner Hatton reported about 50 loads of broken concrete have been dumped into the gully on East Shawwassee street to prevent further caving at that place.
