## "The Apple Cart" To Play At The Wilson

"The Apple Cart" by Bernard Shaw, the first new piece in six years from the pen of this noted playwright, will reopen the Wilson Theatre Monday night, September 29th for an engagement of one week. The comedy is being produced by the New York Theatre Guild. The play has already been successfully produced in London, Berlin, Warsaw, Vienna, and New York. The company which the Theatre Guild is presenting in Detroit is that which performed the play last season in New York. It opens the Theatre Guild's present season in Detroit.

Echoes of the tempest of discussion caused by the premiere of "The Apple Cart" in London flew immediately across the sea. The Theatre Guild's production and the brilliant engagement of the play in New York last season led to still wider comment and analysis of its characters, humor and motif.

"The Apple Cart," like many other Shaw plays, upsets several

rules of the theatre. One of the speeches by the King is 2,500 words long. It is said to be one of the most entertaining moments in the performance. Another innovation is an act playing for an hour and twenty minutes. Mr. Shaw demonstrating that his audiences prefer to have him continue his situations to an appropriate curtain instead of ringing the curtain up and down and interrupting the performance in deference to old-fashioned thumb rules of the theatre. The production throughout is considered an unusual event in the Guild's calendar. It was staged by Philip Moeller, the Guild's producing director, while the magnificent settings were done by Lee Simonson.

In leading roles will appear the Theatre Guild acting company including Tom Powers, Violet Kemble Cooper, Claude Rains, Ernest Cossart, Frederick Truesdell, Jane Wheatley, Eva Leonard-Boyer, Barbara Allen, W. H. Sams, John Dunn, Hannam C. Clark, George Graham, Audrey Ridgewell, George Coulouris, Ferdinand Hast and others.
