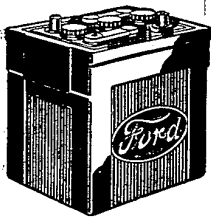

### REGISTRATION NOTICE

#### GENERAL ELECTION

Tuesday, November 4, 1930  
To the Qualified Electors of the Township of Farmington, County of Oakland, State of Michigan.  
Notice is hereby given that in conformity with the "Michigan Election Law," I, the undersigned Township Clerk, will, upon any day, except Sunday and a legal holiday, the day of any regular or special election or primary election, receive for registration the name of any legal voter in said Township not already registered who may Apply To Me Personally for such registration. Provided, however, that I can receive no names for registration during the time intervening between the Second Saturday before any regular, special, or official primary election and the day of such election.

The last day for General Registration does not apply to persons who vote under the Absent Voters' Law. (See Registration by Affidavit.)

Provision in Case of Removal to Another Precinct  
Sec. II—Part II—Chap. III. Any registered and qualified voter who has removed from one election precinct of a township to an-

other election precinct of the same township shall have the right, on any day previous to election, or primary election day, on application to Township Clerk, to have his or her name transferred from the registration book of the precinct from which he or she has removed to the registration book of the precinct in which he or she then resides. Such elector shall have the right to have such transfer made on any election or Primary election day by obtaining from the board of inspectors of such election or primary election of the precinct from which he or she has removed a Certificate of Transfer and presenting the said certificate to the Board of Election Inspectors of the Precinct in which he or she then resides.

### Phone Company Rushes Construction Program

Pushing northward at a rate of several thousand feet a day over the 54 miles from Grand Rapids to Big Rapids, Michigan's newest telephone highway is one of the big construction projects being carried on in the state this year. It is a storm-proof cable, being built by the Michigan Bell Telephone Company at a cost of nearly \$1,000,000.

The cable is designed eventually to span the state to Mackinac City. Besides carrying the long distance telephone circuits to the upper peninsula via that point, it will provide increased long distance facilities for the industrial and resort cities of Western Michigan and extend the trans-state cable now connecting the most important points of the eastern, southern and central sections of the commonwealth. Replacing open wire circuits, it also will assure increased protection for the service against interruption by storm and other agencies. The project, according to Roy E. Crowl, manager for the Michigan Bell company in this area, is in line with the company's policy of meeting in advance of actual need so fully adequate service can be furnished, but also of improving the plant and service constantly.

### Big State-Wide Program

The Michigan Bell Company is pushing work on one of the largest state-wide construction programs in its history. Included in the work is the erection of new buildings, extension of much exchange and long distance cable and the addition of central office apparatus at many points. The telephone construction program is providing work for many men throughout the state. In addition, the use by the company of large quantities of Michigan materials is giving employment to many people.

### Tell How To Kill Off Enemies Of Peaches

East Lansing.—Two insect enemies of Michigan peaches are causing considerable damage in State orchards and growers are advised to use control measures suggested by the entomology department of Michigan State College to reduce the losses caused by the Alabama moth and the lesser peach borer.

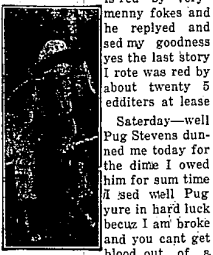
The Alabama moth is a small, clay-colored moth which serapes holes in the skins of peaches to enable it to feed on the fruit pulp. Rot organisms enter the openings made by the moth and the peach decays. The peaches should be picked while they are a trifle green, before they are attractive to the moth, and the picked fruit must be carefully covered to prevent attacks after it is taken from the tree.

The lesser peach borer injures the larger branches and the upper portions of the trunk of peach trees. This borer cannot be controlled by ordinary treatments with paradichlorobenzene but a paint made by mixing one pound of this chemical with two quarts of crude cottonseed oil kills the borers when the mixture is painted upon the infested wood in late fall or early spring. The removal of loose bark and gum from the areas to be treated aids in the destruction.

The Alabama moth is a migrant from Mexico and Central America which reaches Michigan in years when spring is early in the tropics and fall is late in Michigan. The insect attacks cotton in the south and the larvae is known as the cotton worm.
